

The Castle in the Sky

Castle Zaman in Nuweiba brings authentic Egyptian luxury to the South Sinai, Egypt



Oh, but to be a real princess for the day! "I will grant you three wishes," said the genie. Now let's see...umm?! Wish no. 1: a castle set in beautiful surroundings? "Mumkin" [Arabic for "that's possible"] said Hany; wish no. 2: delicious food served 'banquet-style'? "Mumkin," said Hany; wish no. 3: an exquisite choice of beverages and engaging atmosphere providing escape and caper from day-to-day life? "Mumkin," said Hany. No Egyptian genie, but a qualified architect and ex t-shirt manufacturer, Hany Roshdy built castle Zaman (Arabic for the "past") two years ago and has never looked back. I, no princess (at least by birthright;), covered his story on behalf of MIX and visited the castle following the footsteps of a stream of international and local clients who have since made Zaman a favourite haunt of theirs.

Standing 35 metres above sea level, in the H-Borqa mountain on the Taba-Nuweiba road, Castle Zaman is primely located. In the middle of what is known as the 'Golden Beach', overlooking the Ras Burka bay, the castle has its own private sands as well as the added beauty of surrounding sapphire waters and colourful corals. With a dramatic mountainous view across four countries - Egypt, Israel, Jordan and Saudi Arabia - Castle Zaman is still adequate in size but simply breathtaking in stature. A work of art, the castle itself was constructed stone-by-stone using nothing but natural materials: reclaimed wood was used in all construction and furniture and every single stone was handpicked from nearby mountains. Strict adherence was also given to ancient construction techniques, which were specifically revived for the project: a true architectural achievement, the castle revived ancient techniques of building stone vaults and cross vaults. The only building of its



kind in the Sinai, Hany Roshdy explained: "The idea behind Castle Zaman was to develop the local theme within the tourism market: from the architecture to the food, I wanted everything I used to derive from Egypt and preferably the Sinai – nothing imported. There already existed a multitude of 5-star hotel chains and international brands but nothing authentic Egyptian." The brainchild of Hany Roshdy, Castle Zaman was born through his vision and the existence of King Zaman. Hany explained: "Because of the location chosen, the building had to be a castle. The theme of the castle was built around this idea of King Zaman: an underground treasure room was excavated beneath the castle – Zaman's ruins, dug up and discovered." It is obvious it is this very visionary ability which has sporned so many of his successful projects to date, including the hugely successful cartoon character King Dude and 'Say Cheese' rats greeting cards and t-shirts...

The castle itself has an outdoor pool, lit by night, with an overlooking bar area serving a selection of alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks - palm fronds cover the roofs and clay pots are used as lighting units to add atmosphere. Inside, the castle boasts an impressive dining area complete with huge heavy wooden tables and log fireplace. An extensive menu provides food fit for King or Queen: aside from specials, Zaman offers the choice of two staple menus, namely Castle or Slow food. Able to pre-book and reserve a meal, the castle will prepare the food ahead of your arrival with notice. The Slow food menu serves impressive platters of fresh vegetables, royal portions of meats, turkeys and fish, which roasted at a low temperature over long periods of time, guarantee a tasty feast always prepared in original Egyptian earthenware. From the chandeliers that hang throughout the castle to the Japanese Koi pond that meets and greets you at the castle's entrance to the catacombs and underground dungeon-like tunnel, the fine detailing of the castle is astounding.

The castle is open to guests who wish to pool throughout the day and into the nigble for private hire (special events, shool states: High heels are not recommended ble, use the pool at your own risk, the cast and the castle management reserves the serving alcohol when they see fit.
